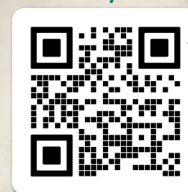

Oakhurst, Ahwahnee & Fish Camp Areas:

1. ADVENTURE ACTIVITIES: Try off-roading with Yosemite Adventure Company, test your lumberjack skills at Yosemite Axe Throwing, or play & sip at River Creek Golf Course. Hire a guide for hiking, biking or rock climbing fun!

2. VIRTUAL REALITY: Immerse yourself in Yosemite's beauty with virtual reality and other movie experiences at Yosemite Cinema.

3. ART INSPIRATION:

Explore art galleries around Oakhurst, from paintings and photography to sculptures and folk art.

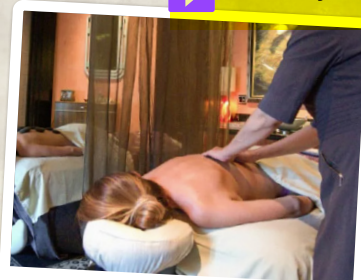

26. SIERRA MONO MUSEUM:

Visit the Sierra Mono Museum and Cultural Center in North Fork to learn about local Native American culture and history.

27. THE CENTER OF IT ALL: North Fork is known as the "Exact Geographic Center of California." Find the official marker and travel back through history at historic landmarks like the Old Mill Site and the Stagecoach Stop.

28. LOCALLY GROWN PRODUCTS:
